Do organisations become walking zombies, following intelligent systems, or do they use this new freedom to boldly shape new business models? Marco Schlimpert, author of the manager magazin bestseller "Human Intelligence," combines informative insights with concrete case studies: asking the right questions, recognising hidden dynamics, deciding under uncertainty, taking real responsibility. He argues that systemic constellation is the most effective method for modern leadership. Short interactive exercises in the plenary makes tangible what leadership now depends on. A live constellation follows, making these dynamics visible.
